Mission Church	Built for the newly emancipated slaves. Erf donated to the Rhenish Missionary Society in 1844. Mission Church was built across the road from the mission school in 1845. Building fulfilled the needs of the mass of recently emancipated slaves of the area. Built with donated funds and the labour of the good citizens of Tulbagh and freed converted slaves.	Many slaves were baptized here, owing in part to a new law forbidding the sale of baptized slaves. Building stands to remind us of the inspiring work of Rev. Zahn and his parishioners who built this church for a mere 300 pounds			
Description	Large spacious thatch roof Hall Church in the Cape Gothic Revival style, features buttress and pinnacles.
